1. Read 1 Peter 1:15-16. What is your initial response to this command?

2. In Hebrews 12:14 we are told that without holiness, no one will see the Lord. Why?

3. Read 2 Chronicles 26:16-23. King Uzziah was described in verse 4 as a good king who did what was right in the eyes of the Lord. However, there was a sad end to the life & reign of Uzziah. What do we learn from this about the holiness of God?

Read Hebrews 12:10. Why does God discipline us? Explain.

4. Read Isaiah 6:1-5. Even the sinless Seraphim could not look on the holiness and glory of God, and covered their eyes and feet. Try to describe what you think was going through Isaiah's mind as he had a vision of the holiness and glory of God.

5. Scan through Isaiah Chapter 5. What is the theme of this chapter?

Read Isaiah 6:5 again. Why does Isaiah say woe is me?

What thoughts and feelings does this bring, concerning your own relationship to God?

6. Read Psalm 37:5-6. What two things does God tell us to do so that our righteousness will "shine like the dawn?" Define these two things relative to our daily lives. (also read Matthew 22:37; Galatians 2:20 and 2 Timothy 1:12)

7. Read Isaiah 6:6-8. What was God's response to Isaiah's cry of, 'woe is me?'

What does it mean that Isaiah's sin was 'atoned' for?
