PLAYING WITH THE BOX



Christian writer and pastor, Paul Tripp, said in a recent message I attended, "I gave birth to a son who just doesn't understand gifts. My wife and I would go out when he was a little guy to buy what we thought was the [perfect] gift. He would tear open the gift, and he'd end up playing with the box. It drove us crazy.

I decided one Christmas that I was going to find ... the gift of gifts that he would not be able to resist. I shopped and shopped. I found the gift. I was so excited.

I was even more excited at that moment when the gift came out from under the tree and he was about to unwrap it - much more excited than he would have ever been.

He ripped open the gift like a little boy would ... and, actually got out this toy and began to play with it. I had a feeling of such victory. I went into the kitchen to get something to drink, was in there for just a few minutes, and came out and he was sitting in the box. I couldn't believe it.

Tripp says, "If you're one of God's children, you have been given the most awesome gift that could ever be given. It's gorgeous from every perspective. It's a gift of such grandeur that it's hard to wrap human vocabulary around it and explain it. It's beautiful from every vista... It's the gift that every human being needs. It's a gift that in all of your work and all of your effort and all of your achievement you couldn't have ever earned; you could have never deserved; you could have never achieved. It is absolutely without question the gift of gifts. It's the gift of the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, [but] I am deeply persuaded in the face of this gift, there are many people who are content to play with the box."

U2 SINGER BONO SAYS,

"THERE MUST BE AN INCARNATION"

After returning home from a long tour, Bono, the lead singer of the Irish rock band U2, returned to Dublin and attended a Christmas Eve service. At some point in that service, Bono grasped the truth at the heart of the Christmas story: in Jesus, God became a human being. With tears streaming down his face. Bono realized:

THE WORLD RECORD FOR MOST CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

In 2001, the Richards family of Canberra, Australia, set the Guiness World Record for the most lights on a house- 331,038 bulbs, to be exact. The family's retina-scorching record stood for more than a decade. Then, in 2012, Tim Gay and his family from LaGrangeville, New York - beat the Richards family. They decorated their house with 346,283 lights. (Many of those were, to add tinsel to injury, synchronized to music.)

The Richards family couldn't stand to be losers so they upped the ante by decorating their house with more than 502,165 lights. (This equates to more than 29 miles of wire.)

But! There is, of course, always room for more light. So, the New Yorkers got their revenge: They covered their own house - and, crucially, its grounds - with a display that involves 601,736 lights. The whole thing took roughly two months to build. It spans two acres. It also involves much more than lights: It includes more than 200 songs, including both top-40 hits and traditional Christmas songs.

As Tim Gay told Guinness, on the occasion of his win: "My family and I are thrilled to bring the World Record back to the United States." He added, "And we're even more excited that we did it with nearly 100,000 more lights than the previous record."

UNTANGLING CHRISTMAS



case you're stressed about getting ready for Christmas - with all that shopping, cleaning, and getting the Christmas decorations up - one company is trying to help. Unfortunately for us, they're in England. Tesco. a British supermarket company, posted an ad for a new job - a Christmas Light Untangler. The company's website offered the following description for the 36-hour-a-week job: "This new position will offer you the chance to show that every little helps, by running the unique in-store service with a friendly, flexible approach and making a genuine difference to the little things that matter to our customers this Christmas."

Tesco says candidates should be able to untangle 10 feet of Christmas lights in less than three minutes as well as check the bulbs for signs of breakage. The ideal candidate should also "be passionate about Christmas," the posting says.

Christmas can certainly be a stressful time, which is a shame because Jesus came as the prince of peace. The angels that appeared to the shepherds in the field announced, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill to all men." Luke 2:14

If we are going to untangle Christmas, we need to find the real message in the midst of all the tinsel, lights, turkey and gifts. Jesus came to this world as a Saviour. ENGAGEMENT RING DONATION



The Salvation Army receives some strange items in its red kettles during the Christmas season. Lieutenant Michael Harper, commander of the Cambridge Salvation Army in Boston said, "In addition to money, I've seen watch batteries, paper clips, safety pins, all sorts of strange things, but this one takes the cake." The gift was a diamond engagement ring given by a widow in honour of her late husband. The Salvation Army says that the anonymous benefactor placed the diamond ring - valued at

\$1,850 - and her wedding band in one of the kettles placed outside Boston's North Station.

The rings were donated along with a note honouring the benefactor's late husband: "I've dropped my wedding ring in your Red Kettle knowing that the money from its sale will buy toys for needy children," the woman

wrote. "In all seasons, my husband was a giver. I especially remember his joy in giving at Christmastime, especially to those in need. To honour his memory, I donate this ring." The rings sold a few days later for an astonishing \$21,000, eleven times their appraised value.

At the bottom of her note, the anonymous donor wrote: "To find out what a man is worth, take away his money and his possessions."
