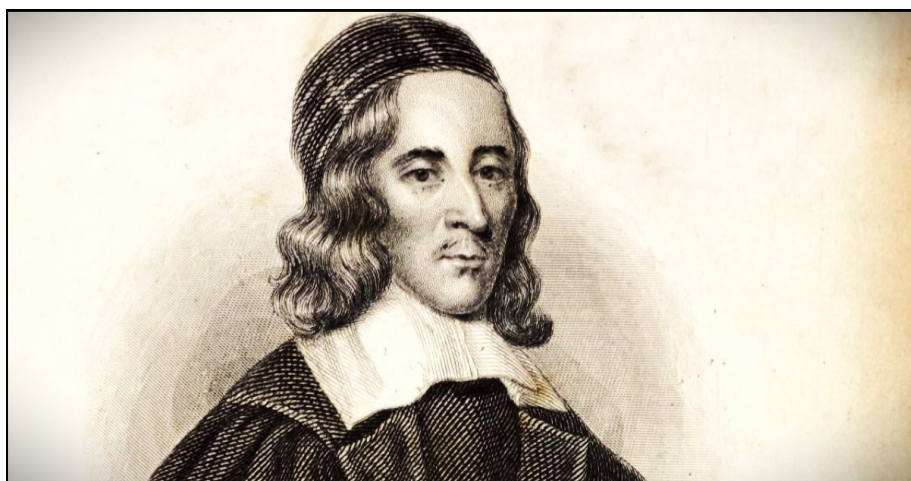


Emmanuel Prayer Needs

Personal Study & Small Group Questions

1. Does anyone have a funny story about going somewhere only to arrive and forget why they went in the first place?
2. Read Mark 1:14-15). Jesus led the woman to confront her sin. Jesus started his ministry by calling for repentance and then belief. Why do you think it is important for a person to confront their sin when responding to Jesus' call?
3. What was the reason you initially came to Jesus? Was it because of a problem you were having? What is a lack of something? What drove you to seek Jesus? (ex: money problems, marriage issues, etc.)
4. Would you say that you've come to find Jesus as better than these things you originally sought him for?
5. Since becoming a Christian have there been times in your life you looked for fulfilment in other things? Why do you think we so often do this? Why do we forget that Jesus is the true "living water"?
6. Many people think of worshiping in "Spirit and truth" to be some form of mystical worship. Dan said it was simply about recognizing that God is Spirit and not bound to a certain building or location (and therefore continually worshiping him anywhere and everywhere), as well as being sincere/honest/humble in our approach to Him. What do you think of this understanding?
(Keep in mind: worship in the context of Jesus' conversation with the Samaritan woman had little or nothing to do with song or music.)
7. How does Romans 12:1-2 bring light to question 7?
8. Worship in that time was about rules, regulations, and locations. You could worship God "properly" without even knowing Him. Do you feel that you do this sometimes? (Go to church and look good, but your relationship with God is suffering). Pray for each other. Seek the Lord and trust his promise: you will find Him.
