1. Read John 18:1-14. It is easy to get our eyes off Jesus and on to the things of the world. To live in our own strength, and not in the power of God. What will it take for us to change?

3. Review the details of those who came to arrest Jesus. Why do you think they sent such a large fore of men?

(Also read: John 6:70-71; 12:6; Matthew 27:1-5)

4. Jesus asked those who came for him, “Who is it you want?” We spend so much time chasing after, and focusing on, the ‘what’ of life. What do you want to be when you grow up? What do you want for Christmas? What are you going to do with your life? What will you do when you retire? What do you want to achieve? What are we going to do if...?
How will our lives be different if we learn to focus on the “who” in our lives?

5. Read John 18:5-6. These are two amazing verses. What do you think happened when Jesus said, “I Am he.” Why did the soldiers fall to the ground?

No matter how big an enemy comes against us, nothing can withstand the power of God’s name, and the power of His word. (Read 2 Peter 1:3; Eph 1:18-20; Eph 3:20; Rom 8:11). The religious leaders of that day think they have solved a problem by arresting Jesus, but in fact they have started something that would change the whole world. How do we need to see the power of God at work in our own lives?

6. Read John 18:7-9. Jesus told them to let the disciples go, and they did, fulfilling what Jesus had said earlier, ‘I have not lost one of those you gave me.’ (Also read John 6:39 & 17:12). Jesus stands between His followers and the enemy, taking on Himself the consequences of hatred and evil.
Read 2 Timothy 1:12. Paul was in prison about to be killed by Emperor Nero, yet He knew that ultimately his life was in the hands of God, not Nero. And Jesus will ‘keep’ you. take a moment and give every area of your life into His hands.
