10. Read John 6:14-15. The people wanted to make Jesus king by force. Why? Why did Jesus leave and what do you think the disciples learned from this miracle? What have you learned?

1. Read John 6:1-15. Put yourself in the place of the boy who gave his lunch to Jesus. Try to put into words what you thought as Jesus took it, blessed it and multiplied it, to feed the multitude.

How do you think this affected the rest of that boy's life?

2. Read John 6:5-7 (and Luke 9:12-13 for more context). Philip saw this as an impossible situation, even though he had seen Jesus perform many miracles up to this point. Why do you think this is?

What area's of life do you tend to struggle in, to believe that God can do something?

3. Read John 6:8-9. Why do you think Andrew brought the boy to Jesus when he doubted it was much use?

Do you have a tendency to try to figure things out on your own before talking to God about it?

4. Read 1 Corinthians 2:5; 2 Timothy 3:5 and Ephesians 3:20. What do these verses tell us we should be relying on. How do we put this into practice in everyday living?

5. Pastor Peter gave six important lessons we learn from this miracle that Jesus did. The first is that this was a test(verse 6). What was the test, and what did Jesus want Philip, and us, to learn from it?

Read Ephesians 1:18-19. Paul prayed for the people of Ephesus. Why did he need to pray for the eyes of their hearts to be opened? What does it mean, 'eyes of their hearts?' and finally, what did the people of Ephesus, and us, need to see?

6. Jesus, "already had in mind what he was going to do." What does this say about the circumstances that we find ourselves in?

Read John 10:27. If we are going to keep in step with the plans of Jesus, what is essential in our lives?
