
What things does God not leave uncertain?

1. Read Daniel 12:1-3. When you went to school, did you ever have to check out a notice board to see if you made a team. Or, later in life, went for an interview, and had to wait to see if you had got the job. What was it like waiting and wondering? What is the difference between these kind of things and finding out if your name is in the book of life?

- 2. Define grace. How does grace apply to you?
- 3. Daniel 12:1 says that there will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then. Now read Matthew 24:3-21. On the page opposite, Jesus' words have been put into 4 categories of hardship and trouble in the world.

Go through each section and try to relate what you read to what you see happening in the world today.

What should be our response to these things?

How should we prepare ourselves?

4. Read Daniel 12:2 and 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. What do we learn from these two passages, with regards to those who die as believers?

What about those who do not know Christ (Daniel 12:2 and Revelation 20:15)

5. 1 Thessalonians 4:17 says that we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. What do the words 'caught up' mean?

There is no definitive statement in the Bible that says when this will happen in regards to the great tribulation. But these verses seem to indicate that it will be when Christ returns at the end of the tribulation. If that is the case, then Christians will have to experience going through the time that is described as the worst distress the world has ever known. In fact, read what Jesus says in Matt 24:22. Although no one wants to go through this kind of distress, why would it be good for others for Christians to be there?
