Be willing to help someone in need.


- "Practice hospitality" Rom. 12:13b

Even in this covid time we can get to know each other in a creative way. Sending notes, texts, meeting outside for a visit, to celebrate the bond of friendships.


## **Additional Study**

- 4. With all this in mind then, what did Jesus mean when he finished by saying, "...and follow me" (Also read 1 Peter 2:21).

Three times Peter reaffirmed his love for Jesus and three times Jesus... 1 John 3:18 Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with and \_\_\_\_\_. v.18-19 Jesus tells Peter: We are called to make Jesus Lord of our life, and to live out our faith in day to day life.

My response:

- 1. Read the Charlie Brown comic on the back. Which way is your deck chair facing?
- 2. 2 Corinthians 5:17 says, "Everyone who is in Christ is a new creation, the old has gone, the new has come". What do you think this means, spiritually and practically?
- 3. Read John 21:1-14. Compare this incident in the life of Peter and Luke 5:1-11. What are the similarities? It is also quite possible that the two incidents took place on the same shore of the Sea of Galilee (Mark 16:7). In addition, Peter denied Jesus sitting next to a fie, and Jesus reinstated him while having breakfast next to a fire. Why do you think all these details are significant?
- 4. In verse15, Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me more than these?" More than what?

Why is it important to make sure that our relationship with God is a priority over everything else? (Read also Matt 22:37).

How does putting Jesus first help in other area's of our life?

- 5. Three times, Peter denied knowing Jesus. Three times, Jesus had Peter reaffirm his love. On the third time (v.17), the Bible tells us that Peter was hurt by what Jesus said. Why?
- 6. In verse 17, Peter said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." By using the verb 'ginosko' the second to say, 'you know that I love you,' Peter acknowledged that Jesus knew his inner feelings and his heart. In fact Jesus knew everything about him. (Read also Hebrews 4:13). How is this comforting, and at the same time, a warning?
- 7. Read 1 John 3:18. God knows the struggle we have sometimes within us. We say we love God, but our actions, emotions and what we say we believe don't always match up. How does the way Jesus dealt with Peter help us?
- 8. Three times Peter reaffirmed his love for Jesus and three times Jesus told him to minister to others who become followers of Jesus. How important was if for Peter to hear Jesus commission him to the work of the Gospel? How important is it for us to realise that we don't have to be perfect to be used by Jesus?

In what ways is God commissioning us to feed, and take care, of His lambs and sheep?

9. Read verses 18-19. Do you think Peter fully understood what Jesus was saying? Also read Luke 9:21-26. Compare the passage in Luke and the words to Peter. What does this mean for us in our lives?
