8. Read Acts 2:1-4. Why did God choose the Hebrew festival of Shavuot (Pentecost) for the Holy Spirit to come?

Passover and Pentecost were established thousands of years before Christ came. But God's plan of salvation had already been put in place. How does this help us to trust in Him, when we are waiting on God? (Also read Proverbs 3:5-6).

- 9. When the Holy Spirit came, there was a violent wind and tongues of fire, that rested on each person there. What do the wind and the fire represent with respect to the coming of the Holy Spirit?
- 10. Peter then preached a sermon in which 3,000 people were saved. Peter wasn't a preacher, he was a fisherman. In addition, the disciples also spoke in different languages, so that everyone could understand the message (See Acts 2:8-11).

This shows us that when God calls us to be His witnesses, He doesn't leave us alone, we work in the presence and power of God. What does this say about God using you as His witness?

11. Pray and ask God how He wants to use you as His witness.
