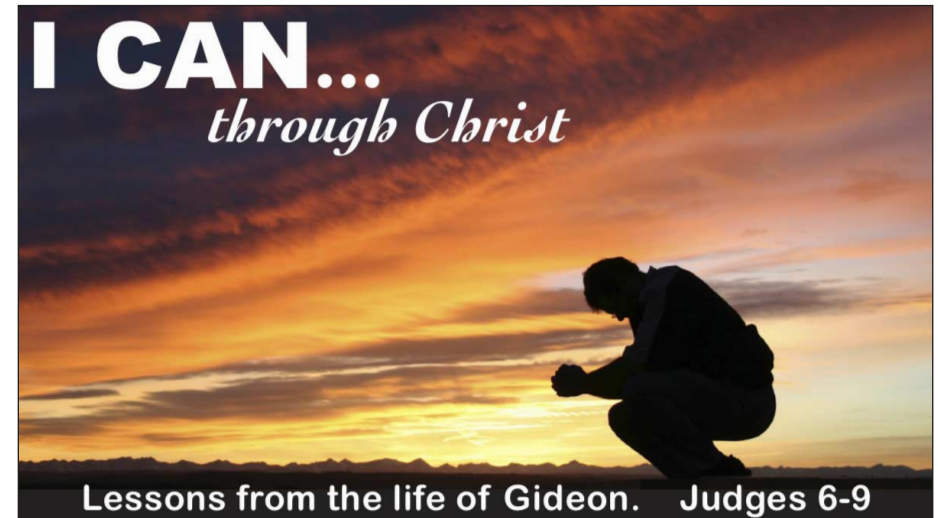
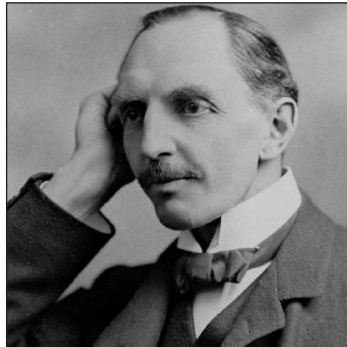

1. Read Psalm 90:10-12. What are these verses teaching us?

2. Read Romans 12:2 and Judges 8:22. Why do you think the people wanted Gideon to be their king?

3. From your notes opposite, what are some of the ways that the world views life, and how to deal with issues, and problems?

4. Read John 6:14-15 and Luke 19:38-44. Why did Jesus weep over Jerusalem?

What was the result of Israel's uprising against Rome?

What do you think are some of the consequences in our lives, of choosing to do things our way, rather than God's way?

5. Read Matt 28:18 and Luke 6:46. If Jesus is going to be our 'king' and be Lord over our lives, what will that look like in every day life?

Peter said that the Bible is the ultimate source of truth in all matters of faith and life. In practical terms, what does that mean? What does it mean when I come up against something in the Bible that I struggle with?

6. Read Judges 8:23-27. Gideon wanted the people to have God as their king. He wanted the people to worship God, and God alone. Unfortunately, he made a foolish decision. What was it, and why was it foolish. Can you see any parallels in life today?

7. Some would say, "What's the big deal, Gideon still wanted to worship God, what's the problem with making his own ephod and worshiping in his own town rather than going to the tabernacle in Shiloh to worship, and seek God?" Why is it a big deal? What was the result of Gideon trying to do the right thing, but doing it in the wrong way - not doing it God's way?

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
