- For all who give time and money toward the Food Hampers for this First Nation, will find peace and joy



- 8. In your own life, how has God shown you His will with regards to decisions you had to make? Determining the will of God isn't always easy. When we think we have determined what God wants us to do, how can we make sure that our actions are in line with the will of God, and not just our own thoughts? Also read Romans 12:1-2; Proverbs 15:22; II Timothy 3:16–17; Romans 8:26-27
- 9. Read Philippians 4:6-7. God promises us His peace when we come to Him with those things that are causing us to be anxious. Certainly, Joseph found peace to make the decision he made. Peter talked about 'praying through', what did that phrase mean? (see your notes)
- 10. Verse 24 tells us, "When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him." There is no greater place to be than to know that your life is in the centre of God's will. Joseph didn't fully understand the situation, but he trusted God with the outcome. Has there been a situation in your life where you needed to do something that you found hard, but you trusted God with the outcome? How did it work out?

6. Read Deuteronomy 22:20-21. The Jewish law is pretty clear on this issue. However, also read Micah 6:8. Later on Jesus Himself, would quote from Hosea 6:6, in teaching the pharisees on how to deal with sinners, by saying to them, "Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice." (Matt 9:13) As a righteous man, Joseph would want to keep the law (Act justly). However righteousness is more than just keeping to the letter of the law, it is to act mercifully (Love mercy). So what was Joseph to do, he was to walk 'humbly with his God', which means that he would do whatever God wanted him to do regardless of the consequences to himself, trusting God.
